



Presentation by the Undersecretary of Industry, Energy and Tourism and the President of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office

I would like this presentation of the 2012 Annual Report of Activities of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office to be a way to analyse last year's results and a means to establish the objectives for the near future.

Both the objectives presented by the Ministry to entrepreneurs and those that I have analysed based on reading this Annual Report have the same aim, which is none other than contributing to reinforcing our businesses and their products, promoting innovation and being capable of providing citizens with an efficient service that helps them to establish a solid position in the market.

I would also like to congratulate the staff of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office for the quality of their work and for their involvement in the development and technological progress of our country.

Presentation by the Director General of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office

It is with a special sense of pride, as the head of this Body, that I address you all through this presentation of the 2012 Annual Report of Activities.

Pride that should be understood as a door that opens up many possibilities of creating, assessing and establishing a policy of actions based on the commitment to efficient and shared work. Pride also in a team that has, throughout the year and through their work, followed through with the objectives that we proposed at the beginning of the same.

I would like to underscore that I am aware that the circumstances have not been easy and that we have had to face new measures that have affected guaranties that were unquestioned up to now, but the final result has been the continuation of our task of serving citizens through work that is based on adapting to their needs and a job well done by us.

We are immersed in a certain social and economic context, and it wouldn't make sense to close our eyes to this reality. Nevertheless, the data we have gathered at the end of the year speak to us about a culture of industrial property that is getting stronger within our business fabric and about our efforts to shorten processing periods without detracting from the quality we offer.

The numerical results regarding applications were the following: Patents: 3,361; Utility Models: 2,517; Industrial Designs: 1,598; Trademarks: 44,029; and Trade Names: 4,998.

There were a total of 148,194 European patent applications in 2012, a 4% increase with respect to 2011, and there were 1,548 European patents of Spanish origin in 2012, an increase of 9.6% with respect to the European total.

In 2012 we continued with the Industrial Property Dissemination Plan at SMEs, large enterprises, associations, universities, technology platforms and all users of the system for protecting their intangible assets who have needed our advising. An example and result of this are the different cooperation agreements that have been signed to foster a solid culture of and education on recognising Industrial Property as an indicator of the economic and technological progress of our country.

With respect to the call for proposals for patent grants abroad, as aid for internationalisation, we went from 870 applications submitted in 2011 to 1,052 submitted this year.

With the campaign, "Trademarks, your future", for the first time we have been able to bring together the different agents who play a primordial role in the world of Industrial Property: proprietors of Trademarks, public and private institutions, sector associations, law offices and industrial property agencies. This has contributed to the great repercussion in the media and in social networks.

It's everyone's job to raise awareness about Industrial Property as a primordial factor for improving our competitiveness, both nationally and internationally, thereby providing a competitive position in the economic system. That's why it is so important for the office, our office, to be a point of reference for everyone who develops an innovation process and requires quality and competitive work when it's time to position their intangibles.

Therefore, I would like to thank all the SPTO staff for their efforts and excellent work throughout the year, especially when it is precisely outside the office when the result of our work acquires value in the market.

Attachment of the SPTO to the Ministry of Industry, Energy and Tourism

The Royal Decree that implements the basic organic structure of the Ministry of Industry, Energy and Tourism was published in BOE (Official State Gazette) No. 36 of 11th of February. The Royal Decree contemplates attachment of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office to the Ministry through the Undersecretary of Industry, Energy and Tourism.

"7. Both the autonomous body of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office and the Public Foundation of the School of Industrial Organisation are attached to the Ministry of Industry, Energy and Tourism, through its Permanent Secretary."

Alberto Casado Cerviño, elected Vice-president of the European Patent Office

Alberto Casado, the Director General of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, has been the Vice-president of the European Patent Office (EPO) since May 2008, where he took over the Directorate General of Operational Support.



New Director General of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office

The appointment of Patricia García-Escudero Márquez as the new Director General of the SPTO was published in the BOE of Saturday, 8th of September.

Patricia García-Escudero has a Bachelor's Degree in Biological Sciences from the Universidad Complutense de Madrid, and she belongs to the Scale of Superior Graduates of Autonomous Bodies of the Ministry of Industry, Energy and Tourism in the Industrial Property speciality.

She has spent her entire professional career at the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, which she joined in 1987 as a career civil servant and where she has been head of the Dissemination Service, head of the Dissemination and Information Area, technical adviser in the Patents and Technological Information Department and head of the Dissemination, Communication and Business Relations Area. Before the appointment, she was the Deputy Director General of Legal Coordination and International Relations at the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office.

2012-2014 Strategy on Industrial Property for businesses and entrepreneurs

The **2012-2014 Strategy** is an initiative of the Ministry of Industry, Energy and Tourism, through the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, which endeavours to establish industrial property as a tool and key factor in the daily decision-making of businesses and entrepreneurs. Its objective is to foster differentiation, specialisation and increased performance of the Spanish production system, thereby helping to improve the competitive position of our businesses in global markets through the strategic use of the protection instruments of Industrial Property (IP).

Industrial Property is a key factor in a company's everyday decision-making. New products, trademarks and designs appear on the market almost every day as a result of the continuous process of innovation and creativity.

Effective industrial property management allows businesses to use their intangible assets to become more competitive and increase their advantage in the markets. Facilitating this management, increasing the industrial property culture and eliminating administrative or financial barriers or obstacles are therefore some of the main objectives of the strategy.



The Spanish Patent and Trademark Office on Social Networks

Among the actions undertaken to increase the visibility of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO) on the Internet, two institutional profiles of the SPTO have been created on **twitter** and **facebook**.

These profiles help to **complete the visibility policy that the SPTO** has been implementing to disseminate and communicate the importance of industrial property and to bring the services it offers closer to applicants.



In February 2012, the SPTO launched its institutional blog on patents and trademarks at the *notiweb* of madri+d (http://www.madrimasd.org/blogs/patentesymarcas/) as a reference point for publishing relevant news about industrial property, where there was interaction with readers' comments the first time.



This new incursion in **social networks** forms a part of the dissemination and communication policy on which the SPTO has ventured.



Ceremony honoring Professor Carlos Fernández-Nóvoa

The Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, the School of Industrial Organisation and the IDEA Agency organised a ceremony to honor Professor Carlos Fernández-Nóvoa, recognised as an authority on industrial property in the Spanish legal system. The ceremony was framed within the activities of the Carlos Fernández-Novoa Chair of Innovation and Industrial Property, created in 2011 for the purpose of promoting an integrated training and information system on Industrial Property and Innovation that facilitates the mutual transfer of knowledge between universities and the business world.

At an organisational level

Instruction from the SPTO regarding reimbursement of the IET (State of the Art Report) or Prior Examination fees

The new instruction regulates the following points:

- The conditions for dispensing with the IET fee when a patent application has been the object of an International Search Report (IBI) by the SPTO as the International Search Administration, in which case the SPTO will not conduct any IET, and the IBI will be mentioned in the corresponding publication.
- The conditions for partial reimbursement of the international search fee of the international PCT application when the SPTO may have previously conducted the IET of the corresponding national application, which is prior to said international PCT application.
- 3. The conditions for reimbursement of the IET fee when it may be based totally or partially on an earlier IBI conducted by an International Search Administration other than the SPTO.
- 4. The conditions for dispensing with the prior examination fee when the patent application may have been the object of an International Preliminary Examination Report (IEPI) by the SPTO as the International Preliminary Examination Administration.
- 5. The conditions for reimbursement of the pre-examination fee when it may be based totally or partially on an earlier IEPI conducted by an International Preliminary Examination Administration other than the SPTO.

This Instruction will be applied as follows:

- Sections 1 and 3 will be applicable to those patent applications for which the continuation of processing is given as from 20th of December 2012, inclusive.
- Section 2 will be applicable to those international PCT applications filed as from 20th of December 2012, inclusive.
- Sections 4 and 5 will be applicable to those patent applications for which prior examination is requested as from 20th of December 2012, inclusive.

This Instruction replaces the Instruction of 15th of October 1999, except for those applications not affected by the preceding paragraph, which will continue to be governed by the previous Instruction.

Publication of national patent applications

National patent applications will be published regardless of the fact that the Report on the State of the Art (IET) may be drafted.

This publication will take place once the conditions established by Article 18 of Law 11/1986 of 20th of March, on Patents, are met:

- 18 months have elapsed as from the application filing date or from the priority date thereof.
- Continuation of processing has been given to the application.
- Drafting of the IET has been requested and the corresponding fee has been paid, if applicable.

Transmission of Industrial Design notifications via e-mail

The Industrial Design e-mail notification service was implemented for those applicants who state in their application that this is their preferred means of notification. This service will increase the efficiency and speed of communications, thereby adapting them to the requirements of the information society.

Modernisation of the Office for improved service

Throughout 2012, the SPTO continued its process of improvement and modernisation.

1. Infrastructures

The SPTO placed considerable effort on consolidating its systems, thereby reducing the existing heterogeneity to make systems more manageable and economical and to facilitate both virtualisation and therefore business continuity. The Office must continue this process to achieve a set of uniform and well-organised systems.

2. Electronic administration

The SPTO provides an electronic application service for all varieties of Industrial Property, in accordance with the provisions set forth in Law 11/2007, on electronic access by citizens to Public Services. In this regard, the various improvements in the services offered by the SPTO should be highlighted:


Electronic window services

Various products for the e-filing of documentation have been used for several years now. These products include Adobe LifeCicle, Virtual Window, SIGEM (a multi-purpose electronic administration product that has been used for those elements that, without being applications, can be processed electronically) and e-OLF (electronic On Line Filing). During 2012, procedures have moved from SIGEM to e-OLF and other technologies, thereby creating uniformity among the various forms of processing. A single solution for all processes will allow costs to be reduced and will facilitate use by not having different interfaces or even different technologies (on-line, client-server, etc.).

Electronic payments

The SPTO relies on several means for receiving payments electronically. The oldest is the payment file transmission system, which dates back to 1999. It is used by large users and allows sending a file to the Office with all the payment orders to be processed. These orders are uploaded to the payer account at the cooperating bank entity. Since 2009, the SPTO has also used the Tax Agency gateway, which requires the use of a certificate, and since the beginning of 2010 there is access to the "La Caixa" gateway.

If all the payments that could be considered electronic are grouped together, we can see how they have increased notably in recent years to the extent that electronic processing has increased (see the attached figure). In 2012, substantial improvement in the conventional payment procedure was prepared, given that hard-copy forms were replaced by Internet forms that must be completed on line before being printed. The aim is to simplify the payment processing of the different types of Industrial Property.



3. Software applications for internal use

During 2012, improvements were implemented in software applications for internal use at the SPTO, with the idea of improving these applications and reducing their cost. The most relevant ones are shown below.

Management of paper documentation and electronic filing

The physical window has reached a high degree of automation in some forms of Industrial Property. ALTERA is a software application developed to process applications at the conventional window for distinctive signs and designs, and its use has been extended to all paper filings. This initiative was a must due to the need to leave Phoenix at the end of 2012, wherefore a "Handover Plan" was developed during 2012, negotiated with the European Patent Office.

The notification by the EPO that Phoenix was being left forced the creation of a single electronic file for the entire SPTO, which had to establish the bases for standardisation of the electronic operation of all the Office's services. A functional consulting service and a technical consulting service were set up, and it is expected that within the first four months of 2013 the new system will be operating and providing services that were previously offered using other solutions.

ALFA, an invention management software application

During 2012, ALFA reached an acceptable level of maturity. During the year it was adapted to the changes determined by the Sustainable Economy Law (LES), and a package of improvements was incorporated. The work to migrate ALFA from Web Logic and Web Logic Integration to open environments has begun (JBoss and JBPM). It is thereby endeavoured to decrease license maintenance costs, leave a product not supported by Oracle and decrease manufacturer dependencies.

At a publicity level

More than 80,000 utility models come to light

The Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO) has digitally published over 80,000 utility models that were applied for between 1940 and 1968.

They can be accessed directly through the SPTO's web page at "Digitised Files".


GSA Spanish invention search

Since 1986, the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office has been publishing Spanish applications for patents and utility models. This has allowed it to publish a complete text in PDF of all applications for patents and utility models and of the granted patents, as well as the translations of European patents effective in Spain. A collection of patents that, due to their characteristics, are of high quality and have very considerable potential for use of the information.

The Google Search Appliance (GSA) is a device created by Google that uses Google's indexing algorithm to index the content determined by an organisation.

Our users have the use of a "Googlean" search for patent documents processed according to the Patent Law: "GSA Invention Search".

Digitisation of the General Archives and of the Historical Archives of the SPTO




General Archives

During 2012, the General Archive has provided external users with a total of 1,210 files that are already digitised.

In addition, 733 were digitised in response to requests from external users.

The database of digitised files, which can be accessed from the SPTO's web page, was updated daily throughout 2012, within an increase in both the number of files and accesses to this database.

Digitisation project of invention privileges

In 2012, the SPTO carried out a digitisation and description project of invention privileges, which constitute the oldest type of Industrial Property (1826-1878).

This digitisation allows the following:

- Dissemination and consultation (unrestricted and free) of the Historical Archive's resources through the web page by linking the images of documents with their descriptive data sheet.
- Expansion of the content of the Virtual Museum, thereby incorporating new images in the galleries of different types of Industrial Property and driving the creation of new virtual expositions with the Office's own means.
- Avoiding the manipulation of originals to favour conservation.
- Obtaining a backup copy of files and ensuring reproduction on successive media without losing content.

New brochures about Industrial Property

In 2012, the SPTO re-published and updated several of its informative brochures on the different types of Industrial Property.

It also published a new brochure, "Why apply for an industrial design in Spain?", plus it translated and adapted four brochures of the European Patent Office, given that they correspond to sectors of special interest for innovation and technological development, the titles of which are the following: "Nanotechnology and patents", "Patents for life?", "Patents and Clean Energy" and "Patents for software?".

Grants for promoting applications for patents and utility models abroad

The SPTO promotes the protection of Spanish innovations abroad to drive the use of our technology and promote the transfer of this technology.


During 2012, for the seventh year in a row, proposals for aid were called to foment applications for patents and utility models abroad.

3,637,225.09 euros were allocated to this aid, which represents an increase of 3.65% over the previous year.

Up to 90% of fees and translations for SMEs and natural persons are subsidised, and up to 80% for all other applicants (foundations, state agencies, private individuals, etc.).

In the 2012 call for proposals, 900 grants were given, corresponding to 3,580 inventions.


The evolution of the number of applicants and of applications granted in the call for proposals is shown in the following graph:



Applications

It should be pointed out that 18% of applicants used the European Patent System to extend their inventions, followed by 11% who used the International PCT Patent System to protect their inventions in various countries of the world. 8% of applicants extended their protection to the United States, 4% to China and Brazil and 3% to Japan, Mexico and Canada.


The six autonomous communities that received the greatest grant percentage were the following: Cataluña (34.74%), Community of Madrid (18.67%), Basque Country (14.2%), Community of Valencia (8.74%), Andalucía (6.02%) and Navarra (4.54%).




Amount by Autonomous Community - International - 2012

The distribution of aid by type of beneficiary was the following: SMEs, 41.31%; large enterprises: 38.13%; natural persons: 14.74%; private foundations: 2.62%; state agencies: 1.65%; and the remaining 1.55% was distributed among state foundations and others.

Regarding the distribution by technological sectors, highlights include the following: Medical or veterinary sciences (11.46%), organic chemistry (7.35%), metrology and testing (4.46%), aircraft (4.33%), buildings (3.92%), electronic communications technique (3.85%) and basic electrical elements (3.56%).

Grants to promote applications for Spanish Patents and Utility Models

During 2012, for the third year in a row, a call for aid proposals was made to foment applications for Spanish patents and utility models. This aid is directed at promoting the protection of inventions through patents or utility models among SMEs and natural persons, thereby subsidising up to 90% of the application fees and/or of the state of the art report.


142,450.56 € were allocated, which represents 15% less than the previous year.

In the 2012 call for proposals, 324 grants were given, corresponding to 720 inventions.

The distribution of aid by type of beneficiary was the following:


- SMEs 61.85%.
- Natural persons 38.15%.

The evolution of the number of applicants and of applications granted in the call for proposals is shown in the following graph:





Regarding the distribution by Autonomous Communities, the position of Cataluña is notable, with 37.2% of the aid, followed by the Basque Country (11.9%), Andalucía (9.6%), the Community of Madrid (7.7%) and the Community of Valencia (9.05%).

Regarding the distribution by technological sectors, highlights include the following: Medical or veterinary sciences (8.46%); furniture and articles for domestic use (7.75%); transport, packaging and storage (6.89%); buildings (6.03%) and technology elements and insulation (4.45%).

During 2012, the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office signed the following Cooperation Agreements to facilitate and drive knowledge about Industrial Property:



On 21th of February, the Director General of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, Alberto Casado Cerviño, signed with the President of LES ESPAÑA-PORTUGAL, José Luis de Miguel Antón

LES ESPAÑA - PORTUGAL, an independent association affiliated with LES Internacional Inc., is an association oriented at supporting professionals and businesses. Its members include business executives, scientists, engineers, academicians, lawyers, patent and trademark agents, civil servants and other professionals from large, medium or small enterprises (private or public), as well as from universities and research centres, government organisations and consulting firms.









On 18th of April 2012, the Director General of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO), Alberto Casado Cerviño, signed with the Director-Manager of AIMEN, Jesús Ángel Lago Gestido.

AIMEN is an innovation and technology centre, recorded in the registry of Innovation and Technology Centres (CIT) of the Ministry of Economy and Competitiveness, and private non-profit entity whose purpose is **promoting the activities of research**, **development and technological innovation in industry** through the development of cooperative R&D&i projects and by providing technological, consulting and specialised training services and all other activities that help to fulfil its objectives.

On 4th of May 2012, the Undersecretary of Industry, Energy and Tourism and the President of the SPTO, Enrique Hernández Bento, signed with the Director General of SERCOBE, Antonio García-Pons Balaña

SERCOBE is the Spanish Association of Capital Goods Manufacturers, which currently includes one hundred thirty industrial businesses and groups and five sector organisations, thereby representing over four hundred businesses and groupings related to the design, manufacture, maintenance and assembly of capital goods.







On 10th of May, the Undersecretary of Industry, Energy and Tourism signed an Agreement with the Director General of Human Capital of GAMESA

This organisation is a global leader engaged in the design, manufacture, sale and maintenance of wind turbines. The Agreement will allow driving knowledge about Industrial Property and the integration thereof in the company's policies, thereby providing more effective protection of R&D&i results.

On 30th of October, the Ministers of Industry, Energy and Tourism, José Manuel Soria, and of Defense, Pedro Morenés, signed a protocol for the promotion of Industrial Property (IP)

A framework of cooperation is established for the purpose of driving, stimulating and facilitating knowledge about and use of Industrial Property rights by the Ministry of Defense in R&D&i programs.



On 13th of November, the Director General of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, Patricia García-Escudero Márquez, signed with the President of ITECAM, Manuel Carrasco Benito

ITECAM, the Technological Centre of Metal of Castilla-La Mancha, arose 10 years ago with the objective of increasing the innovative business spirit of the metal and related products processing sector. Its main objective is to **increase business competitiveness and drive the generation of new products and services** by applying quality technological services, providing adapted and qualified training and providing support and implementation on business R&D&i projects and initiatives.




On 23th of November, the Undersecretary of Industry, Energy and Tourism and the President of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO) signed with the President of the Island Council of Gran Canaria and the President of the Sociedad de Promoción Económica de Gran Canaria S.A.U (SPEGC)

A two-way channel of cooperation is established between the SPTO and the SPEGC for the purpose of cooperation on the dissemination of IP rights and on the management thereof.

Within the framework of the agreements established by the SPTO, the following work on Technology Watch, training and the dissemination of Industrial Property has been carried out:

Agreement with the OPTI: acting as the Permanent Secretary of the Innovation and Patent Forum for the OPTI and joint production of Technology Watch Bulletins on different technological sectors (*Footwear, Agri-food, Metal-mechanical sector, Plastics processing sector, Renewable Energies and the Biomass sector*).



Agreement with the Spanish Technology Platform of Animal Health (VET+i): in cooperation with this platform, which groups together businesses in the veterinary sector, the Technology Watch Bulletin on *"animal health"* continued to be produced on a quarterly basis.







Agreement with the Patent Centre of the University of Barcelona: the following courses were given:

- Workshops on patent studies and updates (alias: "Patent Mondays"). Attended by businesses, OTRI personnel, Industrial Property agents, consultants, patent examiners, etc. Professors of commercial law, European patent agents, a magistrate from the Provincial Court of Madrid and other experts in the sector presented current topics, which were subsequently and extensively debated by the audience.
- Advance course on patents: inter-disciplinary modules and modules on mechanics; on electronics and software; on chemistry and pharmacy; and on biotechnology and biomedicine.
- Practical course for preparation of the "European qualifying examination (eqe)".
- "Patent highlights" courses.

These new courses, organised in cooperation with the Patent Centre of the University of Barcelona and given in English by experts of recognised international prestige, endeavour to offer specialised information on subjects of special interest. Two courses with these characteristics were given:

- **Patents in Life Sciences: An Update**, given by three professors from the firm Hoffmann-Eitle, from Munich.
- Understanding US Patent Reform and What it Means to Your Business, given by two professors from the firm Finnegan, Henderson, Farabow, Garrett & Dunner, from the US.

Agreement with GAMESA: 3 Patent Technological Reports were produced in application of the Agreement.

Agreement with REPSOL: 8 Patent Technological Reports were produced in application of the Agreement.

Agreement with CIEMAT: 1 Patent Technological Report was produced in application of the Agreement, and the SPTO and CIEMAT jointly produced the Technology Watch Bulletin on Renewable Energies: Biomass.

Agreement with CDTI: as in previous years, Technology Watch Reports on patents applied for abroad by Spaniards were produced.

Annual meeting of Regional Industrial Property Information Centres

The annual meeting of the Regional Industrial Property Information Centres took place on the 26th and 27th of March in San Sebastián.

On this occasion, the meeting was organised by the territorial office of the Department of Industry, Innovation, Commerce and Tourism of the Basque Government, and it was attended by 22 delegates from the Regional Centres of: Andalucía, Aragón, Canary Islands, Castilla-León, Extremadura, Galicia, La Rioja, Murcia, Navarra, the Basque Country and representatives of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO).



The objective of the meeting was to strengthen the various Regional Centres and to provide a forum for exchanging experiences, and during the meeting each Centre presented a summary of their annual activities and actions, followed by a discussion about the current situation of the Centres and their future perspectives.

During the two-day meeting, it was clearly shown that the task of the Centres must be emphasised due to their importance in promoting Industrial Property among local businesses and improving their competitiveness.

Currently, the SPTO has signed cooperation agreements with 14 Autonomous Communities regarding cooperation and the provision of services on Industrial Property, resulting in the creation of Regional Industrial Property Information Centres.

Cooperation with Technology Platforms

European Technology Platforms (ETPs), instruments created to guarantee the Lisbon Strategy and directed by industry, endeavour to bring together the different agents involved in a certain technological sector in order to define the medium- and longterm research and technological development objectives for that sector. In turn, Spanish Technology Platforms represent an interesting and successful instrument for reinforcing and complementing European technology platforms, and they allow channelling efforts towards a more committed, planned and structured scenario of innovation.

Therefore, the SPTO's policy contemplates, within its 2012-2014 Strategy regarding Industrial Property for businesses and entrepreneurs contemplates and as one of its lines to follow "increasing business awareness about IP" by organising dissemination workshops and seminars on IP among SMEs, thereby involving multiplier elements such as Spanish Technology Platforms.

Within this context, during the months of June, July and September, various workshops were held between Technology Platforms and the SPTO, clearly showing the need to implement a culture of protected innovation in our industrial sectors as the door to technological and business profit, both within and outside of our country.



The core of these workshops was the responsibility of the Platforms themselves, which presented their scopes of action, their activities within the framework of Industrial Property and their proposals for cooperation with the SPTO.

In order to initiate fruitful cooperation with these Platforms, two patent examiners specialising in the technological sector of each Platform were designated as liaisons with the same for each of the 40 Technology Platforms that exist. Thus, during the last quarter of 2012 and as a result of this cooperation, the SPTO has participated in 23 events organised by the platforms, whose objective has been to disseminate the use of Industrial Property among the members of the platforms.

Innovation and patent forum

The innovation and patent forum is a think tank and consultation body in which the main Spanish sectors of innovation and patents are represented. A final, year-end meeting was held, in which not only were the activities carried out by the SPTO throughout the year presented, but other subjects of interest for the sector were discussed.

International news

• On the 9th and 10th of July, a **Delegation from the Supervising Authority of Industry** and Commerce of Columbia paid a visit.

The purpose of the visit was to hold a series of meetings with the directors of the various departments to gain first-hand knowledge of how the SPTO works, at a time when Columbia's Office is immersed in the process of expansion. Likewise, the subject of CIBEPYME was discussed, the support platform of CEVIPYME and on which Columbia has ventured to serve as a pilot experience.

- On 23rd of March, Carlos Mazal, Director of the Regional Office for Latin America and the Caribbean of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), was with us to discuss certain aspects for organising the Cádiz meeting, held on the 16th and 17th of July 2012.
- On 22nd and 23rd of March, we were visited by a delegation from the **Intellectual Property Office of Montenegro** (IPO MN) for the purpose of learning how the SPTO operates, creating closer ties and improving the exchange of information.
- On 10th and 11th of April, François-Regis Hannart, Director of European and International Cooperation of the EPO, and Patrizia Biani, Head of EPO Cooperation-Spain, visited the SPTO to explain the Bilateral Cooperation Plan (BCP), which is a new framework of cooperation by the EPO with the various European offices and which replaces the previous National Action Plan (NAP). Likewise, this visit served as incentive for the SPTO to increase the dissemination and training activities that it carries out in cooperation with the EPO.

International Registration of Designs

International Design is framed within the International Registration of Designs system for countries that are part of the Hague Agreement, which includes the acts of 1934, 1960 and 1967, the Geneva Protocol of 1975 and the 1999 Geneva Act.

On 18th of September 2012, Spain requested an end to the application of the London Act of 1934 due to the fact that it is falling into disuse and that, the vast majority of the time, the international registrations of designs are done according to the provisions of the 1999 Act, also related to the Hague Agreement.

The incorporation of Spanish Legislation on IP into the legal database of the WIPO, "WIPO Lex"

The World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO), with the cooperation of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO), has introduced into its legal database, "WIPO Lex", the complete texts of the main and subsidiary legislation of Spain that are comprised in the legal framework of Industrial Property.

WIPO Lex, which was created for purely academic purposes, is a unique **search service** for national laws and treaties on Intellectual Property of members of the WIPO, the WTO and the United Nations. It is available for free to the public in three languages -Spanish, English and French- and part in Chinese. It also presents related information that elaborates on, analyses and interprets said laws and treaties.



Agreement with the Czech Republic. Patent Prosecution Highway

On 27^{th} of March, an international agreement between the SPTO and the Patent Office of the Czech Republic was signed in Munich, the purpose of which is to share the working results of both offices.

Reciprocal treatment is thus granted to Spanish and Czech applicants of patents for access to an accelerated patent granting procedure. A Spanish applicant, having obtained a state-of-the-art report that is favourable to the patentability of their invention, could go to the Czech Patent Office and request, for free, the accelerated examination procedure by attaching the favourable report from the SPTO.

This technical cooperation agreement seeks to avoid unnecessary duplication of the work that national patent offices carry out, thereby resulting in a reduction of report delivery times and improving the service of patent offices in terms of quality and speed.

SPTO-OHIM Cooperation

The following projects are included within the cooperation activities between the SPTO and the Office for Harmonization in the Internal Market (OHIM) during 2012: the Technical Cooperation Agreement, the Cooperation Fund, the Convergence Program and TM-View.

• Technical Cooperation Agreement of the SPTO

This Agreement dates back to 2006. Since then and with the agreement renewing annually, activities such as promotion, information, dissemination and advising on the community trademark and design have been carried out.

Cooperation Fund

The Cooperation Fund was designed to promote harmonization and modernisation of national Industrial Property offices, as well as support users of community Trademark and design systems. Experts from the SPTO participate in 12 out of the 18 existing work groups, such as the electronic learning work group, which will provide a platform for training via electronic means; the work group dedicated to the creation of a common portal for applications; and the work group focused on developing a multi-modular database (trademarks, drawings, models and proprietors) to facilitate the enforcement of Industrial Property rights.

• Convergence Program

The Convergence Program seeks to reach a common framework regarding a series of aspects in which the Industrial Property offices of the European Union maintain divergent practices, such as the following: the scope of protection of Trademarks in black and white, the relative reasons for refusal -likelihood of confusion- or the absolute reasons for refusal -figurative Trademarks. Work groups have been created to deal with these subjects, on which experts from the SPTO participate. This program complements the task on common IT tools that is being carried out within the framework of the Cooperation Fund.

• TMview

TMview is a computer tool that allows users to search, for free, the Trademarks of all participating offices, such as the SPTO, both nationally and internationally and of the EU. TMview endeavours to be a platform for the data of the 27 member states of the EU, in addition to information coming from the OHIM and the WIPO.

New consultation tool for European designs

Within the context of cooperation between European Trademark and design offices, 9 new tools have been implemented, an important highlight of which is Designview.

 Designview contains more than 322,000 references to designs processed by the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO), including their legal status. The tool allows a simultaneous search of the bibliographic data in offices such as the Office for Harmonization in the Internal Market (OHIM) of Bulgaria, Benelux, Estonia, Greece, Portugal and Slovakia.

Nice Agreement concerning the International Classification of Goods and Services for the purposes of the Registration of Marks

The Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO) and the Office for Harmonization in the Internal Market (OHIM), within the framework of the cooperation and convergence programs between community Trademark offices, have reached an agreement to offer, to their users and in Spanish, a common and harmonized database of goods and services for the registration of Trademarks.

SPTO-EPO Cooperation

A meeting was held at the headquarters of the SPTO between the European Patent Office (EPO) and the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO) for the purpose of establishing the Cooperation Plan between both offices. The delegation from the EPO was led by the Main Director, responsible for European and International Cooperation, and on behalf of the SPTO, its Director General.

During the meeting, the **lines of cooperation between both offices for the 2012-2015 period were established** regarding training, the implementation of electronic information services on patents and activities for disseminating and emphasising the use of the patent system within the Spanish production fabric.

European Patent Agent Qualifying Examination

From the 5th to the 8th of March, the European Patent Agent Qualifying Examination was given in Madrid. The European Patent Agent certificate, issued by the EPO, allows the holder to represent European patent applicants before the European Patent Office.

The Spanish Patent and Trademark Office was responsible for organising this examination, thereby cooperating with the EPO in its attempt to facilitate the testing conditions for Spanish candidates so that they wouldn't have to travel to Germany.

99 Spanish candidates signed up for the exam, 17 of which passed.

Cooperation with Ibero-America Ibero-American Program of Industrial Property and Development Promotion



Prepatory meeting for the 22nd Ibero-American Summit of Heads of State and Government (Cádiz, 16th and 17th of July 2012)

A highlight within the SPTO's international scope in general and within the strengthening of ties with the Ibero-American community in particular was the Preparatory Meeting of the 22nd Ibero-American Summit of Heads of State and Government held in Cádiz on 16th and 17th of July 2012.

The purpose of the meeting was to exclusively deal with aspects related to Industrial Property and subsequently send, through a special communique, the conclusions on this area to the Ibero-American Summit for its definitive approval.

During the course of these meetings, the Ibero-American Program on Industrial Property and Development Promotion played a crucial role, which was approved in 2011 and began being applied in 2012.

Thus, in parallel meetings, the regulation projects of the Ibero-American Program and the operational plan for the first year were prepared. The plan, split into components, contained the activities to be conducted within the framework of the Program.





Subsequently, on 16th and 17th of November 2012, the **22nd Ibero-American Summit** of Heads of State and Government took place in Cádiz under the title of **"A renewed relationship on the bicentennial of the Constitution of Cádiz"**.

Within the field of Industrial Property, the 22nd Ibero-American Summit approved the regulation projects and the annual plan of activities that had been prepared in the preparatory meeting.

The Ibero-American program is thus reinforced and consolidated. Its general objective is to offer Ibero-American SMEs, universities and research centres an integrated environment of promotion and protection of Industrial Property rights to favour their participation in global and regional innovation systems.



2012 CIBIT Program

The purpose of the CIBIT Program (Ibero-American Training on Patent Searches and Examinations) is to train Ibero-American patent examiners on the search methodology in the various document databases that exist and on familiarisation with technology information services.


In 2012, it included two participants from the Cuban Industrial Property Office, two participants from the Mexican Institute of Industrial Property and two participants from the National Industrial Property Office of the Dominican Republic.

29th Trademark Seminar for Ibero-American Civil Servants



Social campaign against fakes: "I'm original"

The SPTO supports the "I'm original" campaign, which endeavours to make people aware of the various types of consumers and promote a change of mentality in those consumer segments who willingly purchase fakes.

This awareness campaign is being carried out through profiles on social networks: Facebook (I'm original) and Twitter, where, under the user **@YoSoyOriginal**, the attempt is made to create a gesture to reduce the exploitation of people, illegal trade, fraud and the dismantling of the Spanish business fabric, among other harmful effects caused by the purchase of fakes.



Campaign: Mark your Future and "first web eclipse in history"

On occasion of celebrating the World Intellectual Property Day on 26th of April, a web eclipse took place for the first time, called "Mark your Future".

The web eclipse formed a part of the "Mark your Future" campaign, a proposal of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO) and the National Association for Defense of the Trademark (ANDEMA) to make consumers aware of the importance of Trademarks.

The appearance of this eclipse on the web pages of over 140 businesses and public and private institutions attempted to call attention to the combination of positive effects that "revolve" around the Trademark: legality, taxes, employment, health and safety, innovation and design, exports and internationalisation, liability, trade and SMEs.

The web page of the campaign, **www.marcastufuturo.com**, recorded 100 hits per minute, 85% of visits corresponding to Spanish public and the remainder to visits from England, France, Australia, Canada, USA, India, Columbia, Peru, Argentina, Brazil and Russia.

The protection of Industrial Property, whose most visible element is the Trademark, benefits everyone: business owners, consumers and society in general, given that the effects of protecting such rights flow back to society as a whole.

For the first time, the same campaign brings together the different actors who play a primordial role in the world of Industrial Property: proprietors of Trademarks, public and private institutions, sector associations, law offices and industrial property agencies. This has contributed to the great repercussion in the media and in social networks.

Telecommunications media such as El País, La Verdad, ABC, Antena 3, Telecinco, Canal 9, Cope radio, Intereconomía, TV Castilla y León and print media such as Expansión, Cinco días, 20 minutos, Economía Digital, La Razón, El Economista, Qué!, Terra noticias, Stilo and Yahoo noticias covered the news, in addition to hundreds of references on social networks and blogs.

7th of June. World Anti-misbranding Day

On occasion of the presentation of the World Anti-misbranding Day, a press conference was held at Madrid's Barajas Airport.

The press conference included the participation of the Special Delegate of the Tax Agency in Madrid, Raquel Catalá; the Director of the Customs and Special Taxes Department of the Tax Agency, Pilar Jurado; the Director of the National Association for Defense of the Trademark (ANDEMA), José Antonio Moreno; the Director General of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, Alberto Casado; the President of the Spanish Association of Manufacturers and Distributors of Sporting Goods (AFYDAD), Xavier Berneda; and the Director General of the Spanish Association of the Digital Economy (ADigital), José Luis Zimmermann.

The organisers wanted to highlight the importance of Internet purchases in the acquisition of fake merchandise. According to the data provided by the Tax Agency, fake goods sent via "courier" (express delivery) and postal mail, the two routes where fakes purchased via Internet are channelled, represented 10% of all seizures made by the Customs Department of the Tax Agency.

Both the Tax Agency and the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office and the National Association for Defense of the Trademark recalled the importance of citizen awareness in order to reject the consumption of these types of goods.

Balance in the fight against Industrial and Intellectual Property crimes

The National Police and the Civil Guard seized nearly 9 million fake objects in 2011, whose value was estimated at over 694 million euros.

- The sectors of digital storage devices, electronics, toys and audio-visuals were the most affected financially.
- Andalucía, Madrid and Cataluña were the Autonomous Communities with the greatest number of police operations and seized goods.

State Security Forces and Bodies conducted 2,348 operations and detained or arrested 2,101 people for crimes against Industrial and Intellectual Property in 2011. Likewise, 8.79 million objects were seized, valued at over 694 million euros. These are the main data from the balance of operations by the National Police and the Civil Guard against industrial and intellectual piracy published by the Ministry of the Interior, in cooperation with the Ministry of Industry, Energy and Tourism through the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office, the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sports and the National Association for Defense of the Trademark (Andema), an association attached to the Higher Council of Chambers of Commerce.

Out of all the operations conducted, 67.9% corresponded to goods that were seized under Industrial Property, and only 32.1% under Intellectual Property.

The study only refers to seized goods, and it does not include the financial harm derived from the Internet exploitation of industrial property rights not authorised by the holders of those rights. The total value of seized goods increased by more than 50% with respect to 2010 (694 million euros in 2010 versus 461 million the previous year). By Autonomous Communities, Andalucía and Madrid once again led the number of total operations conducted.

By sectors, the one harmed the most was that of CDs, DVDs and related goods (28.1% of the total), electronics and machinery (21.3%) and toys (7.8%). In comparison with the previous year, the percentage drop in the textile and leather goods sectors should be pointed out, while toys remained in third place, with the consequent danger to health and safety.

Fight against Industrial and Intellectual Property crimes

The report gives the following conclusions regarding the illegal distribution of goods:

- Felonies and misdemeanours dropped by 31.1% with respect to the previous year, and arrests and charges dropped by 40.2%.
- Seized goods dropped by 9.5%, yet the value increased by 50.5%.
- The Autonomous Communities with the most felonies and misdemeanours continue to be Andalucía, Madrid and Cataluña, in this order.

Report: "The impact by Trademarks on the Spanish economy and society"

The report, "The impact by Trademarks on the Spanish economy and Society", which was commissioned by the SPTO and ANDEMA to a group of researchers of the Marketing Department of the University of Alicante, has the purpose of quantifying the value of Trademarks in the Spanish economy and society within a well-defined time frame: the year 2010. The report covers multiple sectors, and it took into account over 40 economic sectors that are representative of the Spanish industrial fabric.

The Director General of the Spanish Patent and Trademark Office (SPTO) and the President of the National Association for Defense of the Trademark (ANDEMA) were present when the report was presented.

The value and importance of the trademark lie in its ability to contribute to establishing relationships of trust between businesses and consumers.

From a business perspective, trademarks serve as differentiating and identifying elements, thereby projecting the image and reputation of the goods or services of a company.

In order to estimate the impact by trademarks on the Spanish economy and society, an initial sample of active businesses was identified (312,381) that had at least one worker and a level of annual sales exceeding 1,000 euros in 2010. Of these businesses, those that had at least two registered trademarks (22,177) were used for the study.

The following figures were examined: Employment, GDP, Taxes and duties, Exports, R&D, Contribution to Commerce and Advertising, given that these figures constitute, to a large extent, the engine of growth and the generation of wealth for Spanish society.

Trademarks are key in the Trade sector, thereby generating a volume of over 400 billion euros (60% of the total), and in the country's exterior projection, the value of exports attributable to trademarks exceeds 125.6 billion euros (45% of exports of the Spanish economy).

The share of trademarks in advertising investment represents over 3.8 billion euros (more than 75% of the total).

Moreover, trademarks play a fundamental role in driving R&D, with a total expenditure of around 4.1 billion euros (55% of the total of Spanish R&D), and in contributing to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), with a value exceeding 400 billion euros (40% of the Spanish GDP).

Trademarks allow the Public Administration to take in 73.5 billion euros under the concept of various taxes (46% of total tax income) and 70.5 billion euros under the concept of Social Security contributions from businesses and workers.

Regarding contribution to Employment, Trademarks are responsible for the employment of over 6 million workers (33% of total employment).

Poster Contest. Fight against fakes

To incentivise the creative capacity of designers and entrepreneurs, **ANDEMA**, with the support of the **SPTO**, launched a poster contest designed to reward the best poster design based on an original motto pertaining to the fight against fakes for the campaign that will take place on occasion of the **2013 World Anti-misbranding Day** on the upcoming 7th of June, which will revolve around the objective of promoting social awareness and respect for Industrial and Intellectual Property rights versus the phenomenon of fakes.

92 posters were submitted to the contest, and the following works received awards:

- Second prize: Don't take the bait.
- Third prize: AGV. Mark or-false.

The Spanish Patent and Trademark Office was once again present at the "Mybusiness" Fair, which was held at the Madrid Conference Centre on 14th and 15th of February.

The Fair is designed and conceived to promote the entrepreneurial spirit and support the development of SMEs.

Egética Expo-Energética

From 29th of February to 2nd of March, Feria Valencia organised Egética Expo-Energética, the International Trade Fair on Energy Efficiency and New Technological Solutions in Renewable and Conventional Energies.

Egética Expo-Energética offers all sectors in the energy market the opportunity to promote their latest technologies, solutions and practical applications to a professional and international audience, thereby propitiating an excellent opportunity to increase their presence in the market.

This year it had its own exhibit space, **EGETICA-EXPOENERGETICA INNOVATION**, where selected companies displayed their goods or services.

The Spanish Patent and Trademark Office was present at this event, informing about the services it provides and giving a conference on the "Management of Industrial Property Rights".



International Patent Information Conference & Exposition, IPI-Confex 2012

The SPTO was present at IPI-ConfEx 2012 in Barcelona from the 11th to the 14th of March.

This event is a meeting point for various groups of users and professionals from the world of patent information in Europe. The conference and exhibition are designed to inform about the latest technical advances within this field. It also provides a forum for exchanging ideas.

In this edition, the SPTO presented an illustrative poster on the electronic services it offers to its users.

Awards of the International Exhibition of Inventions of Geneva

From the 18th to the 22nd of April, the SPTO participated at the 40th International Exhibition of Inventions of Geneva, organised by the Swiss Federal Government, the City Government of Geneva and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).

Considered the most important event in the world on inventions, at this edition it brought together the following:

- 789 exhibitors from 46 different countries, mainly from Europe (48%), although followed closely by Asian countries (47%).
- 60,000 visitors from the whole world, distributed between the general public (45%) and business persons specialising in the sector (55%).

The award by the Spanish Patent and Trademark office was given to **Leopoldo Díez Cantó** for his invention, "Stone cutting procedure", thereby obtaining marble pieces of thin thickness and little weight, used to decorate walls and ceilings. He also received an award from the office of García Cabrerizo.

Nicolás Peñefiel Saez received the gold medal and an award from the European Centre for Applied Research for his "Beronesa' bottle with permanent contact between the cork and wine, even in the vertical position".

Vicente Blazquez Navarro received another gold medal for his "Intensive maintenance system for gas and steam networks".

The Spanish delegation presented 9 inventions and received a total of the following:

3 Gold Medals

1 Silver Medal

4 Bronze Medals



Trade Fair of Alternative Vehicles and Fuels








Industrial Property Dissemination Activities. 2011-2012 Comparison





Tools

IP Panorama: Spanish version of "IP Panorama"

IP PANORAMA is an easy-to-use, on-line training product that explains, in plain language, the transcendence and importance of Intellectual and Industrial Property (IP) from a business perspective.

It is conceived to help SMEs to use IP in their business strategy, but it is also very useful for increasing the awareness of business owners and university students about IP.

IP PANORAMA has been developed jointly by the Korean Intellectual Property Office (KIPO), the Korean Association for the Promotion of Inventions (KIPA) and the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO). There are various versions of this product, and the Spanish version, which is accessible through the SPTO's web page, has been supervised and approved by the SPTO.

Inventory of Intangible Assets: new on-line training modules

The **Industrial Property Classroom** includes **two new on-line training modules** that facilitate the taking of an Inventory of Intangible Assets at an organisation.

The "Inventory of intangibles and management of intellectual capital" module presents the initial concepts of intangible assets and intellectual capital that allow an inventory to be taken.

The second module, "How to take an inventory of intangibles at an organisation", together with the document, "Inventory of intangibles", and the Guide for use provide practical help for identifying and managing intellectual capital.

These modules form a part of the SPTO's strategy so that businesses and entrepreneurs learn about and use the Industrial Property system as a relevant tool for the success of a business.

Courses

UIMP Course - Reinforcing the business product: Trademarks and Designs

From the 9th to the 13th of July, the following course was given at the Menéndez Pelayo International University of Santander: "Reinforcing the business product: Trademarks and Designs", organised by the SPTO.

The course was inaugurated by the Undersecretary of Industry, Energy and Tourism and the President of the SPTO, together with the President of the European Patent Office, the President of the Office for Harmonization of the Internal Market and the Director General of the SPTO.



The course is an instrument for informing about how Industrial Property has become an indispensable factor of the competitiveness of Spanish firms in global markets.

This year, the course focused on Trademarks and designs, thereby emphasising the differentiating value provided by Trademarks and the aesthetic importance of designs.





Cátedra de Innovación y Propiedad Industrial Carlos Fernández-Nóvoa

Course on Administrative Management of Industrial Property (Paralegals)

The 2nd edition of the Course on Administrative Management of Industrial Property (Paralegals) was held.

This course is directed to professionals of Industrial Property Agencies, personnel of the Industrial Property Departments of firms, OTRIS (Offices for the Transfer of Research Results) of universities, Technological Parks, OPIs (Industrial Property Offices), etc., and in general at all professionals interested in the management of Industrial Property.

Objectives of the course:

- Offer theoretical and practical training to participants on Industrial Property, inventions, distinctive signs and designs.
- Provide in-depth training on all relevant aspects of Spanish protection systems.
- Provide structured and continuing training on international protection systems: European, PCT, US, Chinese, etc.
- Emphasise the exchange of experiences among the various sectors involved, both nationally and internationally.

The course is framed within the activities of the Fernández-Novoa Chair, whose purpose is to promote an integrated training and information system to facilitate the transfer of mutual knowledge between companies and universities.



4th Course on European Patent Law

The SPTO, in conjunction with the CEIPI (Centre d'Études Internationales de la Propriété Industrielle) of the Robert Schumann University of Strasbourg, the EPI (European Patent Institute) and the EOI (School of Industrial Organisation), has continued to organise the course on European Patent Law, with the fourth edition already having begun (2012-2014). The course is designed for the initial years of the professional practice in the patent area, and it serves as the basis for initiating specific training on the European Qualifying Examination (EQE) for Patent Agents. It is targeted at professionals with technical training, both in industry and in Technology Transfer Offices or Industrial Property Agencies. The nature of the classes is practical, with exercises, questions to be solved and presentations.

Workshops

Advanced workshop for SME advisers-agents on the protection of innovations through Intellectual-Industrial Property and on specific, practical aspects of invention protection through patents.

Throughout the last quarter of 2012, the SPTO gave four editions (in Badajoz, Bilbao, Pamplona and Valencia) of the "Advanced workshop for SME advisers-agents on the protection of innovations through Intellectual-Industrial Property and on specific, practical aspects of invention protection through patents", in cooperation with various consortiums of public and private entities formed into 'nodes' of the Enterprise Europe Network (EEN) in Spain. The excellent disposition of these consortiums and the national coordination of the EEN network in Spain were key to the organisation and success of these workshops.

The content of this workshop, which lasted two days, was developed as part of the European "IPeuropAware" project, in which the SPTO participated between 2008 and 2010. Its format was tested with great acceptance in the first pilot editions of the workshop in 2010.

The program includes a combination of theoretical and practical training on a wide range of subjects related to the management of intellectual property, the protection of innovations -especially through Industrial Property registries- and technology watch, thereby using public databases and patent information technology services.

The main objective of this training is to train employees of entities that, in one way or another, provide daily advising for SMEs on subjects of innovation so that they can given SMEs sound advice on everything related to innovation as a part of the correct management of their intellectual capital.

The surveys answered by students showed a very high level of satisfaction with the training received in these workshops.

Encounters with others

A new edition of this event was conducted. Directed mainly at patent examiners, the purpose of this type of encounter is to provide Spanish companies that are knowledgeable about and regular uses of the patent system with a venue to not only present their business activity but also explain how they use the system, and point out its weaknesses and strengths. These encounters have arisen from the conviction that the better the SPTO's workers know who they are working for, the better the SPTO will do its job. The invited company was TELEFÓNICA DIGITAL. 50 examiners attended the encounter, which turned out to be a very exciting and interesting colloquium.

Technical workshops on the use of the SPTO's information and services

During the months of April and June, workshops directed at specialists of organisations that would like to use the SPTO's information and services were given.


The objectives of this cycle of workshops are to offer participants a practical and detailed vision of the following:

- Consultation services that, through the web page, allow obtaining public information about data and documents related to processing.











Datos de efectivos. Situation at 31 dec. 2012

Distribution of current staff by gender. Situation at 31 dec. 2012








Distribution of staff by groups. Situation at 31 dec. 2012




Age pyramid. Situation at 31 dec. 2012









Budget of Costs by Chapters. Years 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012 (in thousands of




Comparison of Costs by Chapters. Years 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011 and 2012 (in thousands of €)






Incomes Budget. Years 2008-2012 (in thousands of €)



Industrial Design Applications byAutonomous Community with respect to the no. of inhabitants; their design activity, 2012




